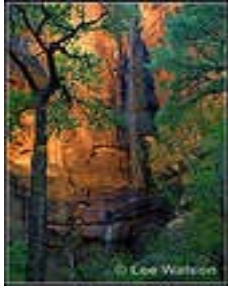

DAY 1

- *Guided tram tour of Zion National Park*. The Zion National Park's mission is to preserve the dynamic natural process of canyon formation as an example of canyon erosion and to protect and preserve the valuable cultural, geologic, vegetation and wildlife resources while providing safe, sustainable and cost-efficient access for visitors' enjoyment. Established in 1909 as Mukuntuweap National Monument; it was upgraded to a National Park in 1919; Kolob Canyons National Monument was added to Zion National Park in 1956.
- View "*Zion Canyon - Treasure of the Gods*" at the Zion Canyon Giant Screen Theatre.
- *Box Lunch* included with a beverage and dessert.
- *Dinner buffet* for each passenger.

DAY 3

DAY 4

- *Breakfast buffet* at the hotel.
- Stop at the *Lost Valley Museum* and scenic drive through The Valley of Fire. The *Valley of Fire* is Nevada's oldest and largest state park and derives its name from the red sandstone formations and the stark beauty of the Mojave Desert. The park offers a full-scale visitor center with extensive interpretive displays. Rest stop and lunch on your own in downtown Las Vegas.
